1 in 6 homeless youth in Sacramento are LGBTQ

For the first time ever, Sacramento County has begun tracking sexual orientation and gender identity as part of its federally mandated homeless point-in-time counts. Findings support a push for more LGBTQ homeless services, and the city's first homeless shelter for LGBTQ youth has just opened.

New state funding for LBQ women's health

Gov. Gavin Newsom recently approved \$17.5 million to create the Lesbian, Bisexual, and Queer (LBQ) Women's Health Equity Fund under the California Department of Health. Funds will support cultural competence training for health care providers and improve LBQ women's access to healthcare, domestic violence programs, and substance abuse programs.

Anti-conversion therapy bill passes California Assembly

AB-99 is a non-binding resolution calling on all Californians, especially religious leaders and educators, to embrace family and community acceptance; counsel LGBTQ persons "from a place of love, compassion, and knowledge of the psychological and other harms of conversion therapy"; and model equitable treatment.


