June 17, 4:30 – 7:00 p.m. San Joaquin Pride Center Presents: "We Are Family" Drag Show!



Pride Month Action Items | AB 959 Audit

LGBTQ+ Californians have a unique opportunity to come together and highlight the importance of this topic during Pride Month by educating the community and sharing their views with their elected officials.

A recent audit of the California Department of Public Health's (Public Health) role in collecting, reporting, and using sexual orientation and gender identity (SOGI) data revealed that CDPH has been slow to adopt and enforce standardized guidelines to ensure the consistent collection and reporting of SOGI data. This has limited its ability to identify and address health disparities among members of the LGBTQ+ community. The results of the audit indicate that changes to state law are warranted to stimulate more consistent SOGI

data collection practices. Here are some things you can do to help:

- 1. Educate within LGBTQ+ community spaces about the shortcomings of the current legislation and its failure to adequately address health
- disparities experienced by LGBTQ+ Californians. 2. Distribute information about this issue through your social media contacts, share it with social media influencers, and provide it to anyone who can rally community members around this cause. Encourage them to take action now because this is a matter of public health, and it is our lives and the lives of the people we love that are at stake!
- 3. Start and circulate a petition to garner support and advocate for revisions to improve the utility of AB 959. 4. The National Center for Transgender Equality maintains a State Action Center directory where you can learn more about 2023 legislative
- priorities and locate contact info for your elected representatives: https://transequality.org/state-action-center#CA. 5. Write your representatives and demand that they address the priorities raised in the auditor's report now! Remind them this is a matter of public health, lives are at stake, and the current law has proven to be completely inadequate for years at this point. We want equity in health now – no more half measures and token gestures! Enough is
- enough! 6. Identify allies who work in a local county or health jurisdictions. Encourage them to obtain training on SOGI data collection, implement best practices within their jurisdictions, and make SOGI data reporting
- publicly available. 7. Identify and engage in public education and mutual aid efforts that address the root causes of health disparities impacting our community members: healthcare access, housing and homelessness, employment and income inequality, racism and reparations, inclusive schools, etc.
- 8. Educate LGBTQ+ peers and community members about the benefits of SOGI data collection, and how answering personal questions about sexual orientation and gender identity is about ensuring that LGBTQ+ people receive equal access to health care services and experience equal outcomes in health and wellness.


Gender Health Center is hiring an Executive Director!

JAMA Clinical Guidelines Synopsis: Standards of Care

for Transgender and Gender Diverse People

The Journal of the American Medical Association (JAMA) has published a synopsis of the World Professional Association for Transgender Health's (WPATH) Standards of Care Version 8 (SOC-8) released last year. JAMA's article highlights major recommendations as well as a review of evidence, benefits and risks associated with gender-affirming medical and/or surgical treatment (GAMST) for adults and adolescents originally published in the source document. The authors recommend SOGI measures be included in all population-based surveys for better understanding of the healthcare needs of transgender and gender diverse people.
